Reception News

It's been another busy week in Reception where we have continued learning to understand our feelings with our friends in the 'Colour Monsters' book series, with 'The Colour Monster Goes To School' book.

Children have also been enjoying our creative areas in class in a variety of activities such as creating faces from natural resources and making monsters using play dough. Drawing club this week has been based on the traditional story of 'The Three Little Pigs' and has inspired children to use their imaginations whilst writing within their cusp of confidence in the form of a magic code providing a purpose for writing which has proven to be engaging and fun.

Individual and sibling photos were taken this week and we hope you enjoy your child's first Reception photo.

Congratulations to all our certificate winners this week! Our school celebration certificate this week was around Justice.

Please remember when collecting Reception children at home time please enter and leave the Reception playground via the same gate located near the main gate, even if you are coming or going to the other playgrounds to collect older siblings. Please avoid walking through the gates where the Year 1 teachers are handing over their classes. Thank you.

Challenges!

Reading: Please read at home each night with your child, this can then be recorded in your child's reading record. Your child's reading book will be changed weekly. You can record any story that you read or share together at home.

Bedtime story: Every Friday a recorded bedtime story will be published on Tapestry, read by one of our team for you and your child to enjoy together. This can be recorded as a 'read' in your child's reading record.

Phonics: Next week, we will be beginning our Phonics learning journey using Bug Club. Each week we will send home a phonics video for your child to watch and join in with at home recorded by one of the EYFS team.

Tapestry: Don't forget to add your adventures to Tapestry—the children love sharing their photos on the big board and this really helps to support their speaking and listening skills.

Weekly Routines

PE will be inside on Monday afternoons—Please send your child to school in their PE kit every Monday.

Reading books—Reading books will be changed weekly. Reading books and diaries should be bought into school everyday.

Other books can be recorded in you child's reading record.

Library books—Our library sessions takes place each Friday. Please make sure your child returns their book each week in order to choose a new one .

Water bottles—Please make sure your child has a named water bottle with them in school every day as it is thirsty work in Reception!
