#### Taking holidays in term time.

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Missing school can negatively impact a pupil's progress and stop them from reaching their true academic potential.

If you feel that there are exceptional circumstances, you should make an application to your the school. You must get permission from the headteacher if you want to take your child out of school during term time. You may be asked to provide a form of evidence dependant on the circumstances.

You could be fined or face legal action for taking your child out of school during term time without the school's permission.

Any leave of absence request should be completed on the PA connect app. Once this has been done, your request will be reviewed and then a member of staff will be in contact with you regarding the outcome.



#### Lateness



We are recently noticing a large number of children arriving late to school without an agreed arrival time. This will impact your child's overall percentage of attendance.

Persistent lateness to school can significantly disrupt academic performance, social dynamics, and overall students well-being, leading to long term, negative consequences.

Whilst we understand that there are certain situations where this cannot be helped, it is important that you keep communicating with us. This is to help us better understand, or to be able to help with the improvement of late arrivals, addressing any barriers that may be contributing to this. If your child arrives to school after the gates have closed, or if they have an agreed later start time, you must accompany them to enter school via the office. You must sign them & support them in using our InVentry console in the reception area. You will be asked to give a reason for their lateness, please make sure you complete this accurately, as it is recorded on your child's attendance.

If a later arrival time has not been agreed, should your child arrive after 9am, they will be marked as 11 on the register. Any arrivals after 9.25am are marked as 'U', which goes down as a missed/unauthorised mark! Please can also use the InVentry console to specify your child's lunch choice for that day. Please see the menu in the main reception.

#### PLEASE BE REMINDED THE SCHOOL GATES CLOSE 9AM PROMPTLY!

If you or your child have an appointment, or know that you will be arriving to school late for any other reason, please inform the office via email your child's lunch choice for that day. This is so the kitchen can be provided with the correct number of lunches. Should we not receive your lunch choice, we cannot guarantee your child will be able to have their preferred option.

Should your child's choice be baguette, please state which filling they would like to have.
